- All the extra downloadable resources, so that you can make the most out of the course in the classroom.
- News and updates related to teaching and learning English.

1. REGISTRATION

Visit <u>pt.thecambridgeteacher.org</u>, click on **Register now** and fill in the fields with your details and those of your teaching centre:

When you input the first four digits of your centre's postcode, the next field will allow you to select your teaching centre within all centres with the same postcode.




If after writing your postcode the page indicates that there are no centres with that postcode, or if your school doesn't appear in the dropdown list, click on the link <u>Can't find your teaching centre?</u> This will allow you to fill in a contact form that will be sent to your local office, where they will deal with your request. After adding your teaching centre to the list, they will get in touch with you so that you can complete your registration.

After completing your registration, we will send you a validation email to the email address you gave us at registration. This email, which will come from <u>portugal@thecambridgeteacher.org</u>, will include a link you will have to click on to confirm your registration.

What to do if you haven't received your confirmation email

The School MasterCode

The School MasterCode is a unique code that identifies your teaching centre which your local office will provide if you're using courses by Cambridge University Press. It is optional at registration.

- If you don't fill it in at the time of registration, you will only have a **GUEST** access to The Cambridge Teacher. This will allow you to see sample versions of our titles, with demos of our digital products and selected downloadable resources.
- If you fill it in, you become a full user of The Cambridge Teacher. This gives you access to the digital teacher products and full range of resources linked to any titles adopted in your centre, and sample versions of other books.


It is an optional field, so you can register first as a Guest and add it to your profile later on. If you do so, all the books being used at your school will be added to the Catalogue so that you can include them in your Collection and access their full content. If your centre is using Cambridge courses but you don't know the School MasterCode, place a request to your local office with this <u>contact form</u> or on the **Contact** section of the page, selecting the subject *I don't know my School MasterCode*.





2. ACCESS TO YOUR COURSES

After registration you will access your main page, which is called My Collection:



Your Collection is where you'll need to add the titles you want to have access to, so that you can create your personal library of Cambridge titles.

How can I add titles to My Collection?

From My Collection, which will initially be empty as shown in the image above, click on **Add titles**. This will take you to the Catalogue where you can choose the books you want to access by browsing through the different types of course.




To add a title, click on the 💽 icon on the top right of the cover.

Whenever you want to add other titles to your collection in order to access their content, you can do it from My Collection or while browsing the Catalogue.



The Catalogue

The Catalogue is divided into the different learning stages so that it is easier for you to find your courses. On the image below you can see some of the titles available for Primary as an example:



The titles that are already included in your Collection appear with a colour frame and have been shadowed, allowing you to distinguish them at a glance. From the Catalogue you also have direct access to your Collection using the link on the right area of the screen.

What does The Cambridge Teacher give me access to?

This depends on whether you entered your School MasterCode or not, which can be done at registration or later on.

• Users who haven't entered their School MasterCode have a **Guest access**. This means that they can only see **sample versions** of our titles, with demos of our digital products and selected downloadable resources. Sample versions are clearly marked with the icon **Sample** on the bottom left corner of the book's cover:



• Users with a validated School MasterCode are full users of The Cambridge Teacher, which gives them access to the books being used at their teaching centre, as well as sample versions of the rest of the catalogue.



When adding these books to your Collection, you will have access to:

- **Digital Products**, such as interactive whiteboard software and Test Generators (depending on the course).
- The full range of **extra downloadable resources** associated to the course you're using with your students.

How can I remove titles from My Collection?

All the book covers in your Collection include the icon 🕒 on the top right corner. To remove that particular title from your Collection, just click on the icon:



You can also remove a title from its own resources page. To do so, just access the book and click on the link **Remove from my collection** on the top right corner:

Even if you remove a title from your Collection, it will always be available in the Catalogue while it is being used at your teaching centre, and you'll be able to add it to your collection if you need access to it again. The sample versions, with limited content, are always available as well.

School MasterCode validation


In order for the Catalogue to show the full titles being used at your centre, you need to **add your School MasterCode to your profile**. You can do this either at registration or after having created your account at The Cambridge Teacher.

The School MasterCode is a unique code that identifies your teaching centre, which your local office will provide if you're using courses by Cambridge University Press.


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In order to add the School MasterCode to your profile after having registered, use the box labelled **Validate School MasterCode** that appears on the right corner of your screen, whether you're in the Catalogue...



... or if you're in your Collection:



If your teaching centre is using Cambridge courses but **you don't know the School MasterCode**, place a request to your local office with this <u>contact form</u> or on the **Contact** section of the page, selecting the subject *I don't know my School MasterCode*.

If after having added the School MasterCode to your profile you still don't have access to the courses you're using, please contact your local office via this <u>contact form</u>. They will verify your centre's details and get in touch with you. You can also access the form on the **Contact** section, selecting the subject *We can't see the books being used at our centre*.

Access to books from previous years/next year

The platform gives you access to the courses you're currently teaching, not to past or future courses. You also have access to the sample versions in the Catalogue if you wish to do an initial assessment of a course.

If in your centre you wish to evaluate a specific course in depth, with the view of adopting it for the next school year, contact your local representative or request it through your local office with this



<u>contact form</u>. You can also access the form on the **Contact** section, selecting the subject *I want to review a title for next year.*

3. THE COURSE IN DETAIL

From your Collection, click on the cover of the book to access all its contents.

In the top area you have access to the **digital products** and other online platforms – in the example below, the course offers interactive whiteboard software and a Test Generator. Some of these digital products, such as the Test Generator below, are available both online (by using the button **Open**) and offline (with the button **Download**). Others, such as Presentation Plus below, are only available to be used offline with the button *Download*.



In the bottom area you'll find extra **downloadable resources** that will help you get the most out of the course. They're divided into categories, according to their use and purpose, which will make it easy for you to find exactly what you're looking for: *Info & Demos, Assessment, Home-School Connection, Learning Journey, Multimedia* and *Extra Resources*.

Inside each category, resources include an icon to identify the type of file and to help you locate what you need more quickly:







4. MY PROFILE

The section **My Profile** allows you to update your details, change your password or even close your account. To access this section, click on your name on the top right side of your screen.

To change your **email address or teaching centre** you will need to place a request to your local office using the buttons **Request change**, which will lead you to specific forms in the **Contact** section.

Important: if you change your teaching centre, all the titles in your Collection that were associated with your previous teaching centre will be removed. To access the books being used by your new teaching centre, you will need to enter its School MasterCode.

You can also change your password in the My Profile section:

Remember that your password will have to be at least 8 characters long.

Finally, you will also be able to close your account at The Cambridge Teacher from My Profile:

You will have to enter your password to avoid closing your account by accident. If you do choose to close your account, all your details will be removed from the site and you will need to create a new account to access your courses.



5. ACCESS TO THE CAMBRIDGE TEACHER

The Cambridge Teacher is an **online platform**, but most of the content in it can be downloaded to be used offline.

Interactive whiteboard software (Presentation Plus) is only available as a download; once downloaded, it is executed on the computer's browser, but without the need for an internet connection. Test Generators are typically available for download but can also be used online.

The extra resources are also available online, but most of them are downloadable, so you can save them on to your computer to use offline.

Access from your tablet or smartphone

You can access The Cambridge Teacher **from a tablet**, using the browser you have installed, in the same way that you would visit any other internet site.

For some of the downloadable resources you will need a Viewer app (PDF, Word, excel). Also, some of the downloadable resources are compressed with .zip, so in order to open them in your tablet you will need an app able to decompress zip files.

For technical reasons, **mobile access** is limited to the homepage – you won't be able to access your Collection or the Catalogue from a mobile phone.

6. DIGITAL PRODUCTS: ACCESS AND TECHNICAL QUERIES

Most of the digital products for Cambridge courses accessible through The Cambridge Teacher are downloadable zips, with some of them also available for online use.
